The theme of this year's conference is *Enhancing Wound Care Quality: Global Collaboration for Local Action*.

Being involved in the area of orthotics and prosthetics, you will inevitably come across amputated toes, feet and lower legs, some of which are the result of diabetic foot complications. Treatment of chronic wounds is important for many reasons, but so is the prevention of wounds – lymphedema is another problematic area which can cause leg ulcerations in your patients. Among many other sessions, you will find a practical workshop on casting/offloading on how to apply TCC or CCO with NWPT on the DFU. These topics and many others are covered at the EWMA 2020 conference, which is one of the best opportunities to network with clinicians, scientists and teachers in the world of wound healing. The topics on the conference will be covered by the most influential and reputed speakers in Europe and is a unique opportunity to upgrade your knowledge in the area of wound care and prevention.

About EWMA and EWMA conferences

EWMA is a European umbrella organisation, linking 53 organisations in 35 countries as well as individuals and groups with an interest in wound care. The primary focus of EWMA is to improve the management of non-healing wounds across Europe, as these types of wounds are still not managed according to existing evidence-based guidelines in many countries.

The EWMA conference is held every year in May or June in a European city and attracts international experts, clinicians, nurses, doctors and industry professionals from Europe as well as the rest of the world. The conference offers a large exhibition (around 160 companies), almost 1,000 scientific presentations, network opportunities and sharing of knowledge and experience between international colleagues.

The conference is organised in cooperation with the Tissue Viability Society, TVS.
